Another summer has come and gone, and as the routines of the autumn fall back into place and our schedules fill up with activities, life and programming in our life together, as members of Christ's Church, do, too. There will be Bible studies, choirs, prayer groups, times for fellowship, for devotion, for growth. This fall we are looking to put together a coherent picture of all that we do, as an intentional body of followers of Jesus. We will be engaging in a process which will help us to connect dots to see how the various activities of our churches work together to foster our spiritual growth, and to gain clarity on where we each fit into that picture personally.

We look forward to receiving her ministry among us, as she shares her perspectives and pastoral care with the members of our communities.

One of the questions that I hope to explore in both of our communities this fall is around the 'what' of discipleship and disciple-making, as it is associated with our visibility in our respective communities.

How do we best serve the people we serve, for the sake of building up faith in Jesus? What is working, for us, that brings us back week-after-week? How might we have more of the things that God is using, in our midst? What are some avenues for broadening these things that we haven't explored before? As we engage this topic in faith, we will seek God's hand of guidance, together. There is also the ongoing question of our specific contexts: what new things is God leading us into at this time, in this place, with this group of people? Prayerful consideration of these questions is a must for every faith group, and I encourage you to add such petitions to your own prayers daily.

As we move forward in faith together, let us do so in certain trust that God is guiding us into newness of life, into renewal of mission. The One who is faithful will accomplish His plan among us.

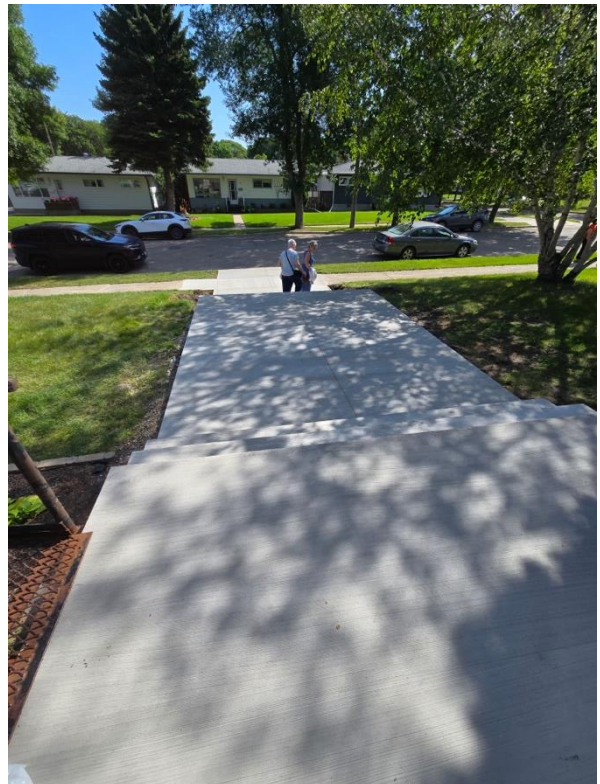
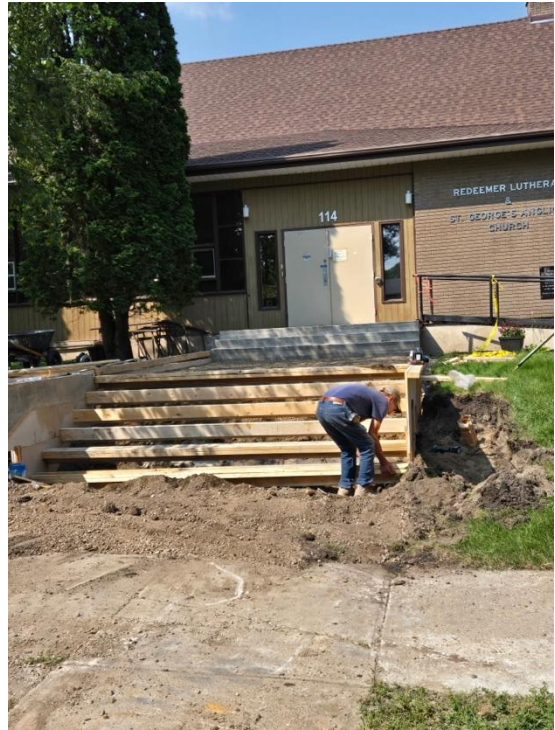
