Sometimes we forget that; sometimes we can get caught up in the whirlwind of tasks-at-hand, of required deliverables, of fires to put out, of urgent and loud demands on our attention. Sometimes we can be caught up in the seemingly never-ending relay of the swings in the economy, and our own financial situation. But we are good news people – God has spoken His counter-narrative into our lives, and through us into the world.

While so many of the concerns the world offers us end up blinding us – like a snowstorm – so that we can only bear uncertainty into a future that we can barely glimpse, Jesus' counter-narrative (the story we tell) is one of assurance, of peace, of stability. It is a word that the world needs to hear, and that we need to be constantly reminded of. Because the whirlwind of the snowstorm demands our attention. But we, like Peter, live a different story than the way of the world – a story where people who aren't distracted by the wind and waves are walking on the water.

This is why our devotional practises are so important in our lives. Disciplined fasting or giving of alms or celibacy are about denying ourselves pleasures in life, and as we deny these from ourselves, we learn to deny self. As we come after Jesus, it is important that we learn to deny self, and to take up our own cross and follow. This is the way of Jesus. Disciplined time set aside for reading Scripture and listening to the Holy Spirit's voice is about receiving a spiritual nourishment that we are all in need of, for we do not live by bread alone but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. Disciplined time set aside for prayer, communicating our hopes and dreams, listening for God's considerations on the matters-at-hand, is about growing more deeply in love and normalizing relationship with the God who made us. Disciplined service to others is about training our hearts and minds to see God in those created in His image.

God has given many ways to us, put them at our disposal, by which our lives may be drawn more closely to His. As we engage with these, it is important that we return thanks to the One who made the way, that He is the focus of our engagement rather than the tool that we engage through. As we do so, our lives are more openly statements of God's good news for the world. We are the embodiment of that message, as He witnesses to the world through us. We become the story that we tell – the story of the counter-narrative of Jesus, who has undone the power of sin and death, and drawn us to be co-creators of His new Creation.
